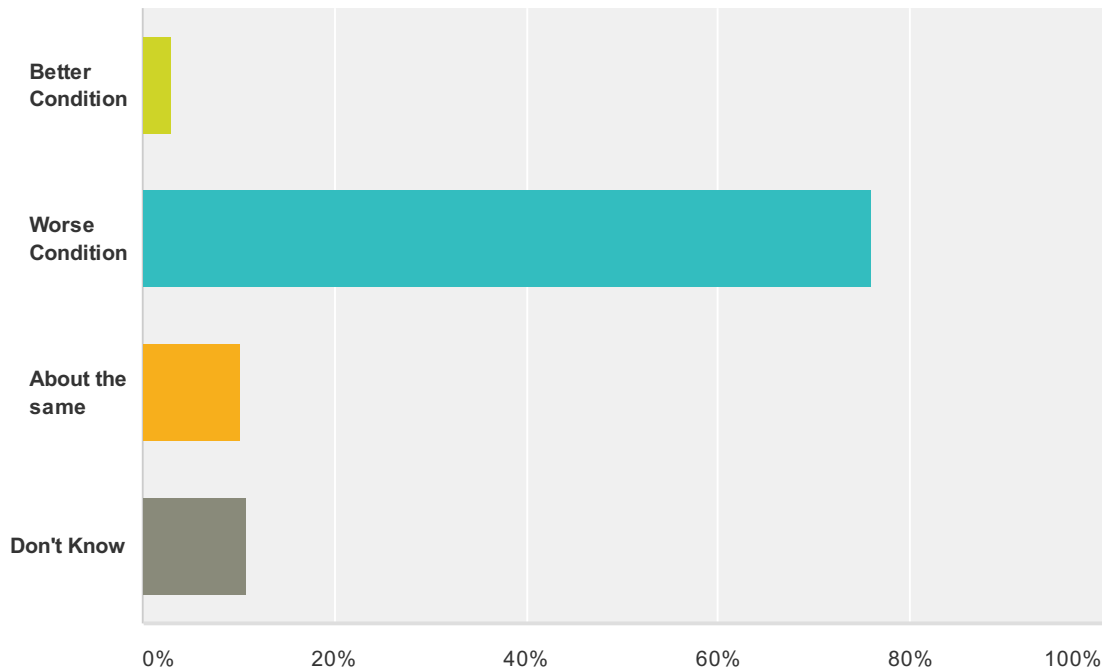


### Q1 Compared to 10 years ago, do you think the condition of the Great Barrier Reef is better, worse or much the same? (tick one)

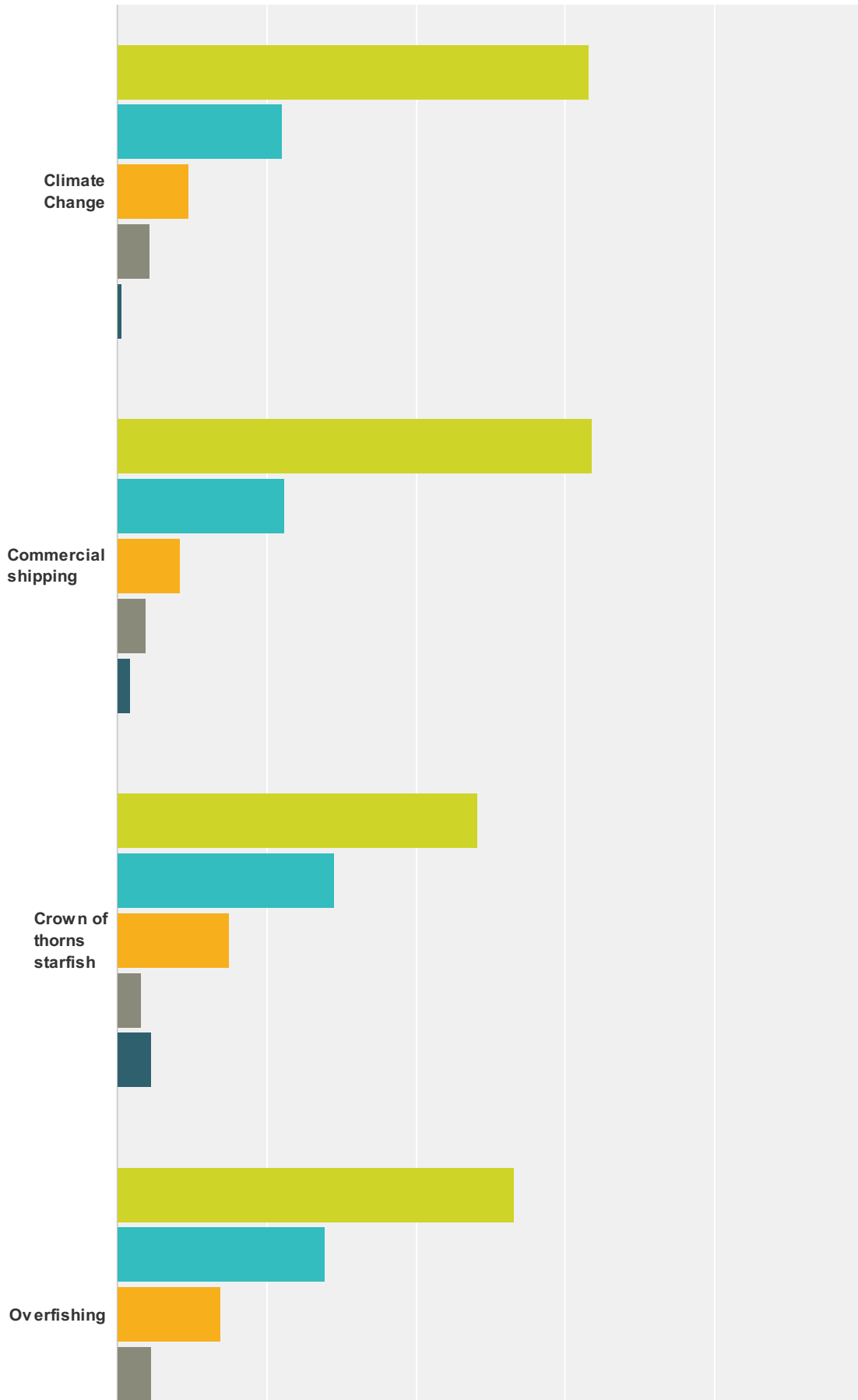

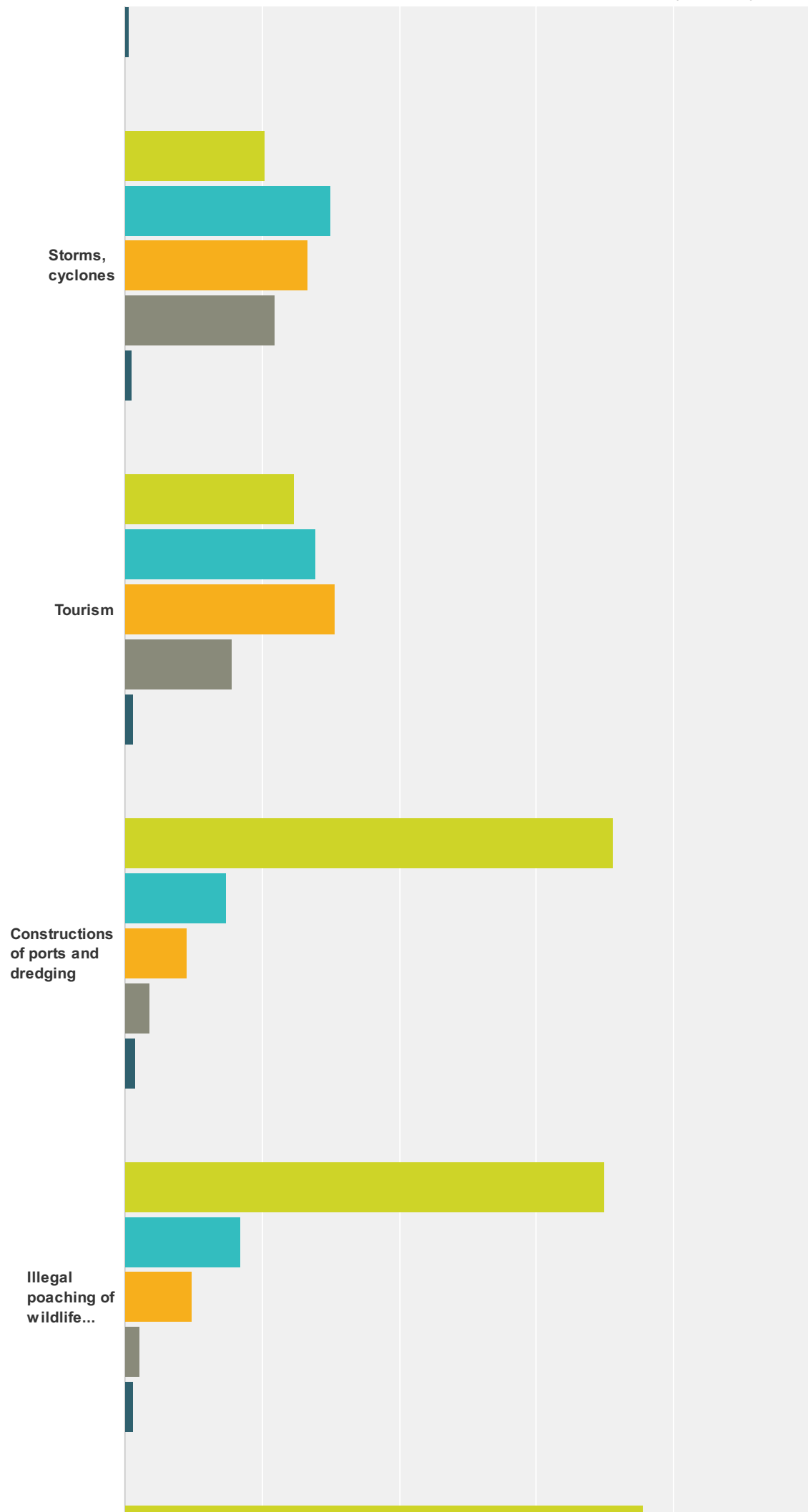

**Q2 There are a number of potential threats to the Great Barrier Reef. How concerned are you about each of these? (mark one response for each threat)**

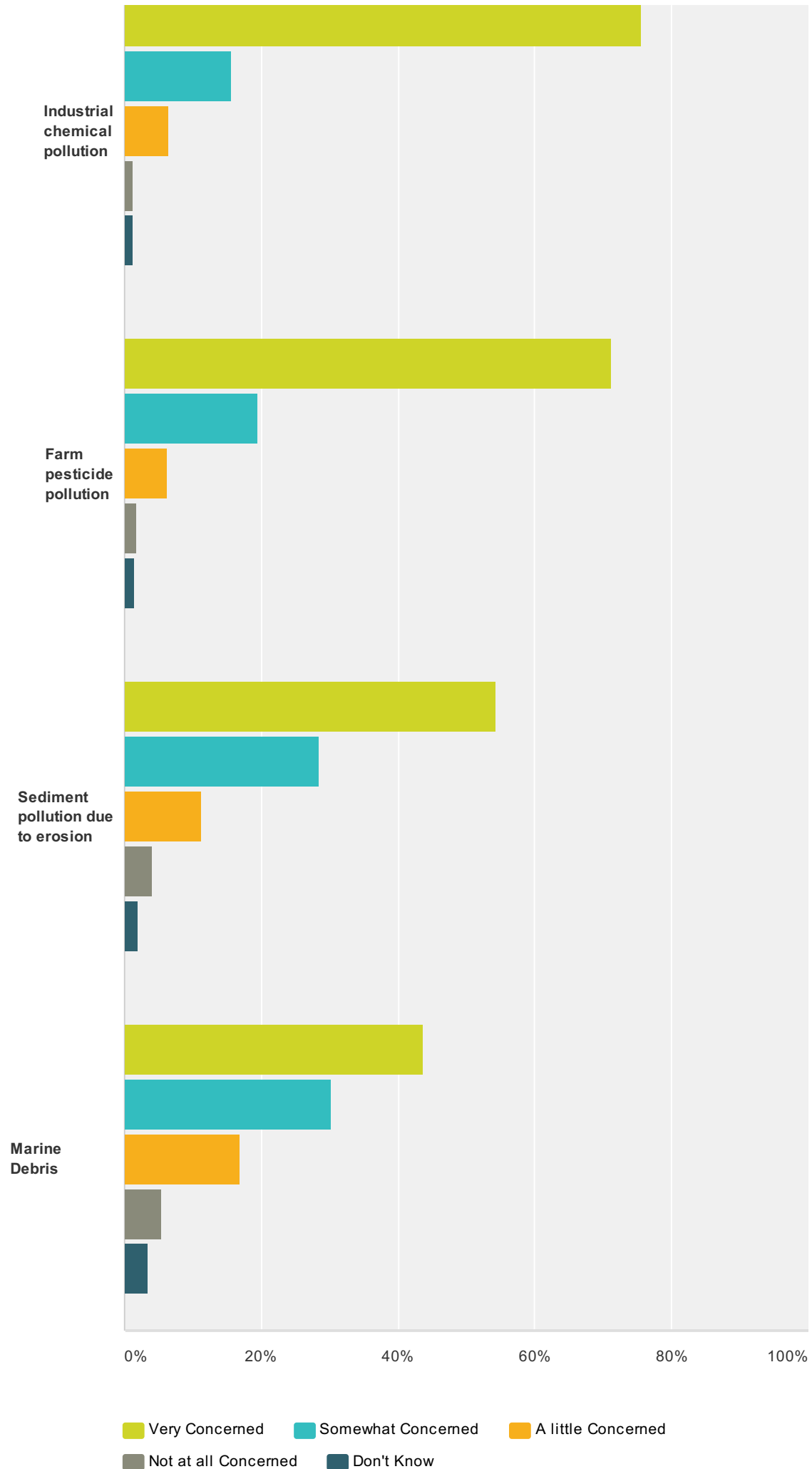

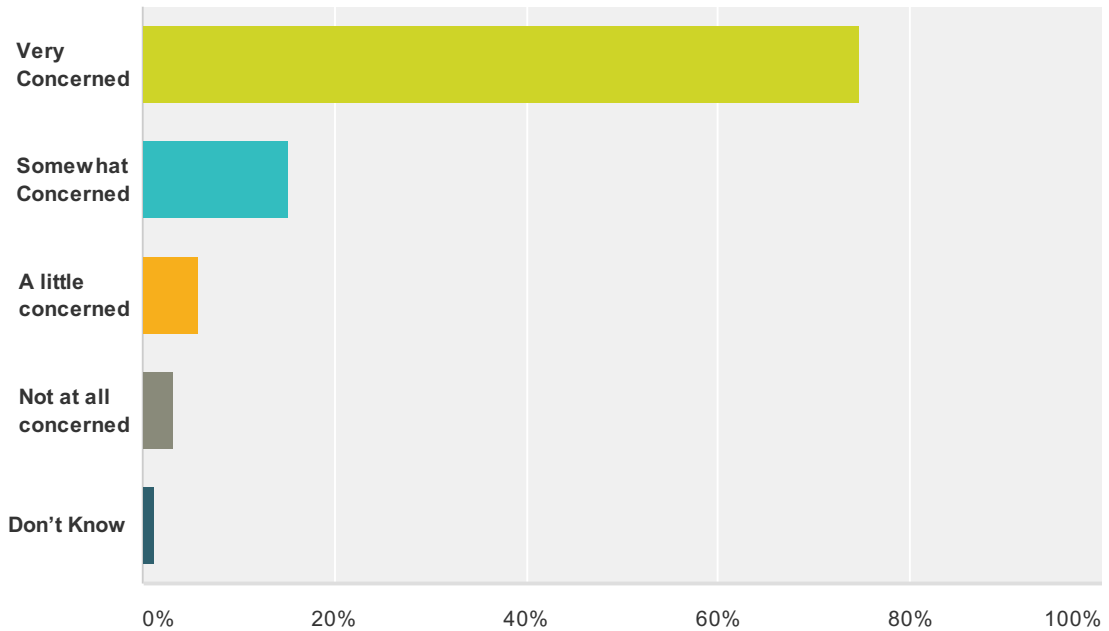

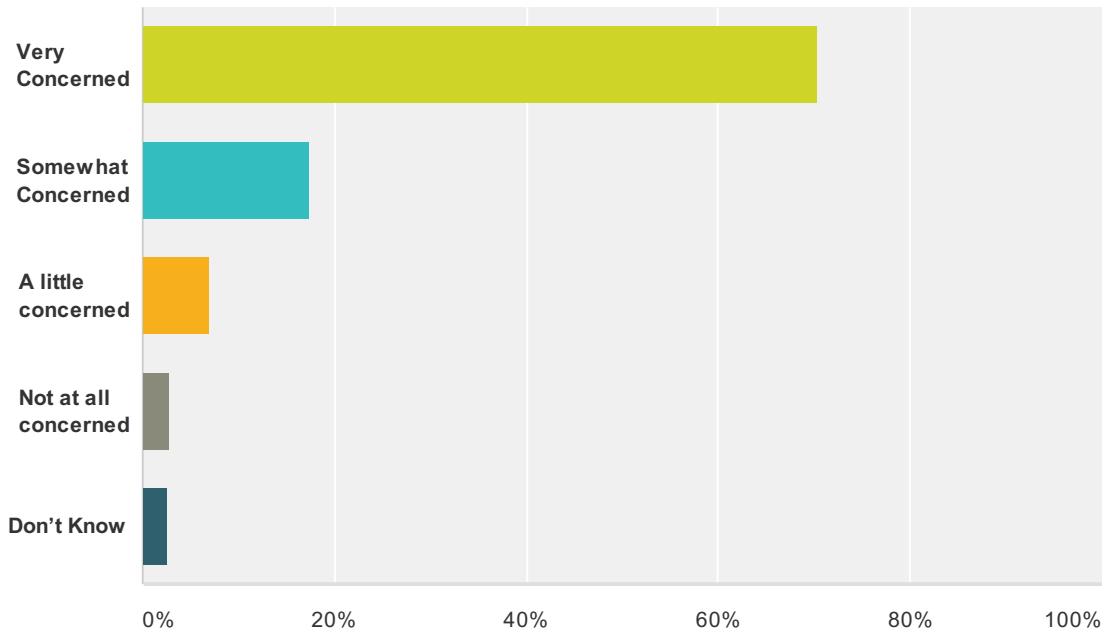

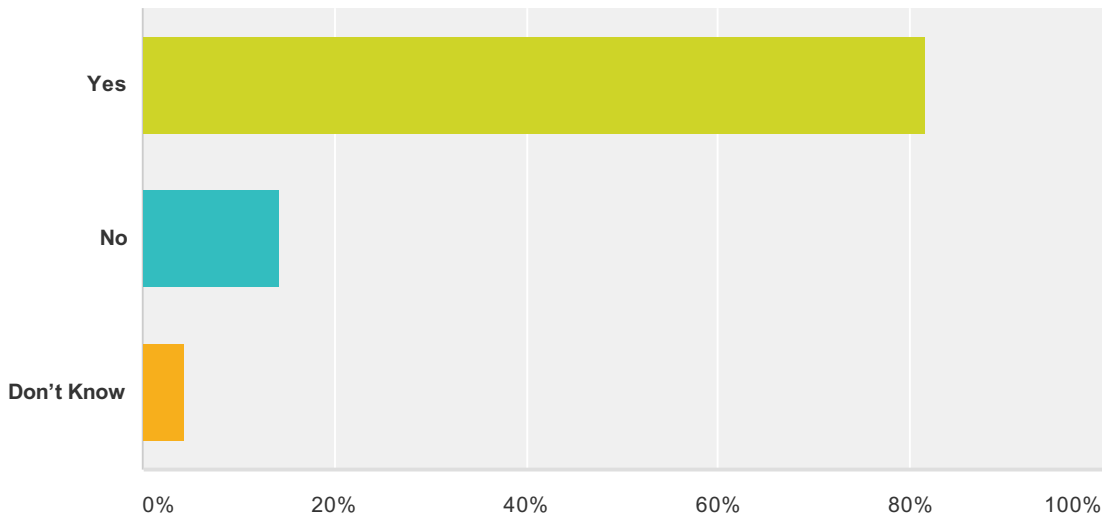

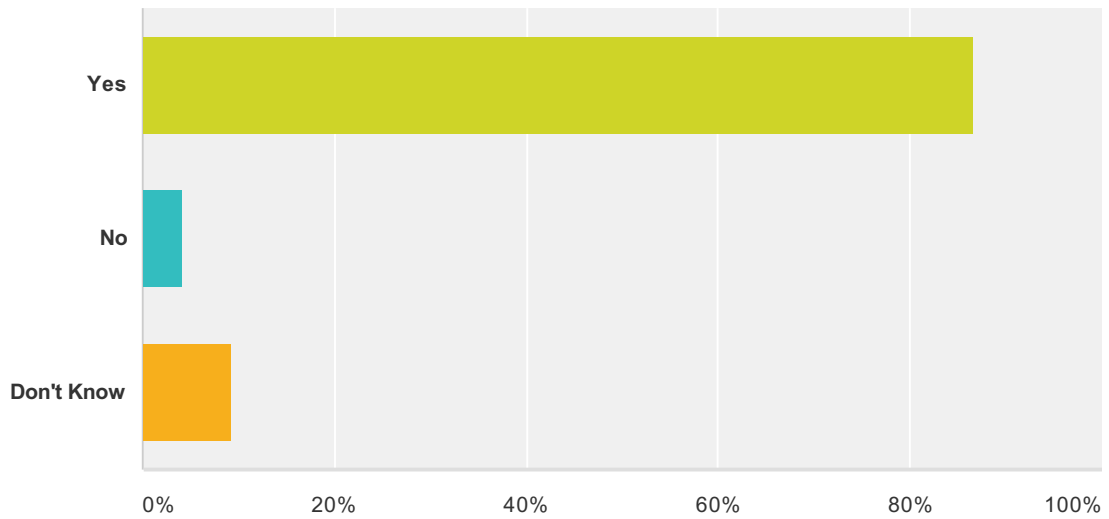

### Q6 Would you support expanded stream bank revegetation projects to improve the quality of water draining to the Reef?

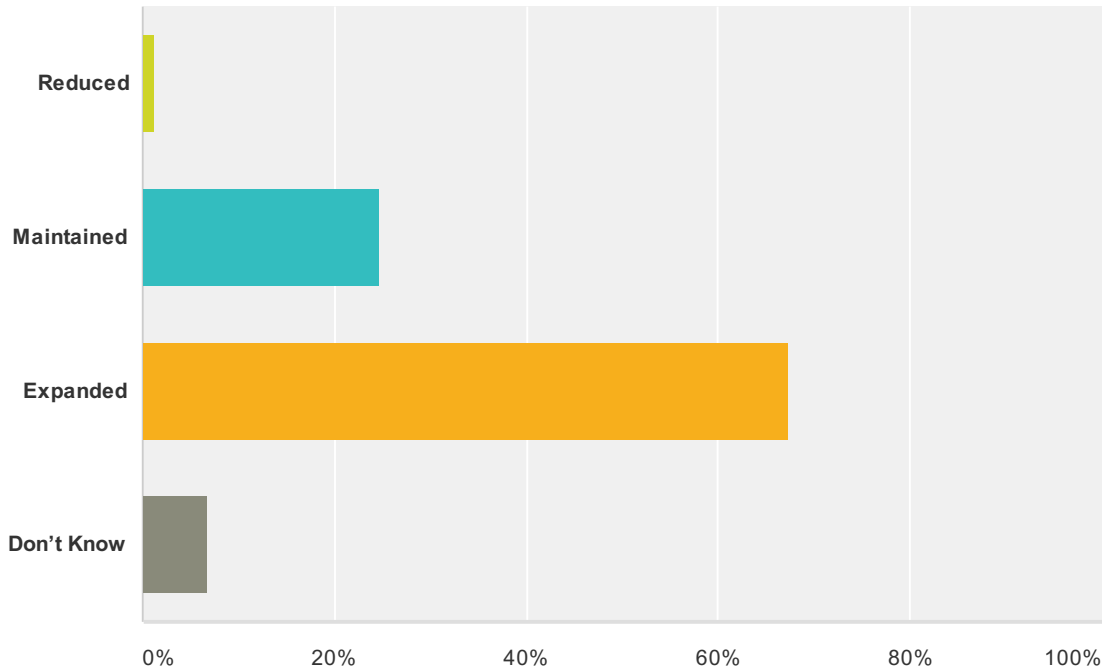

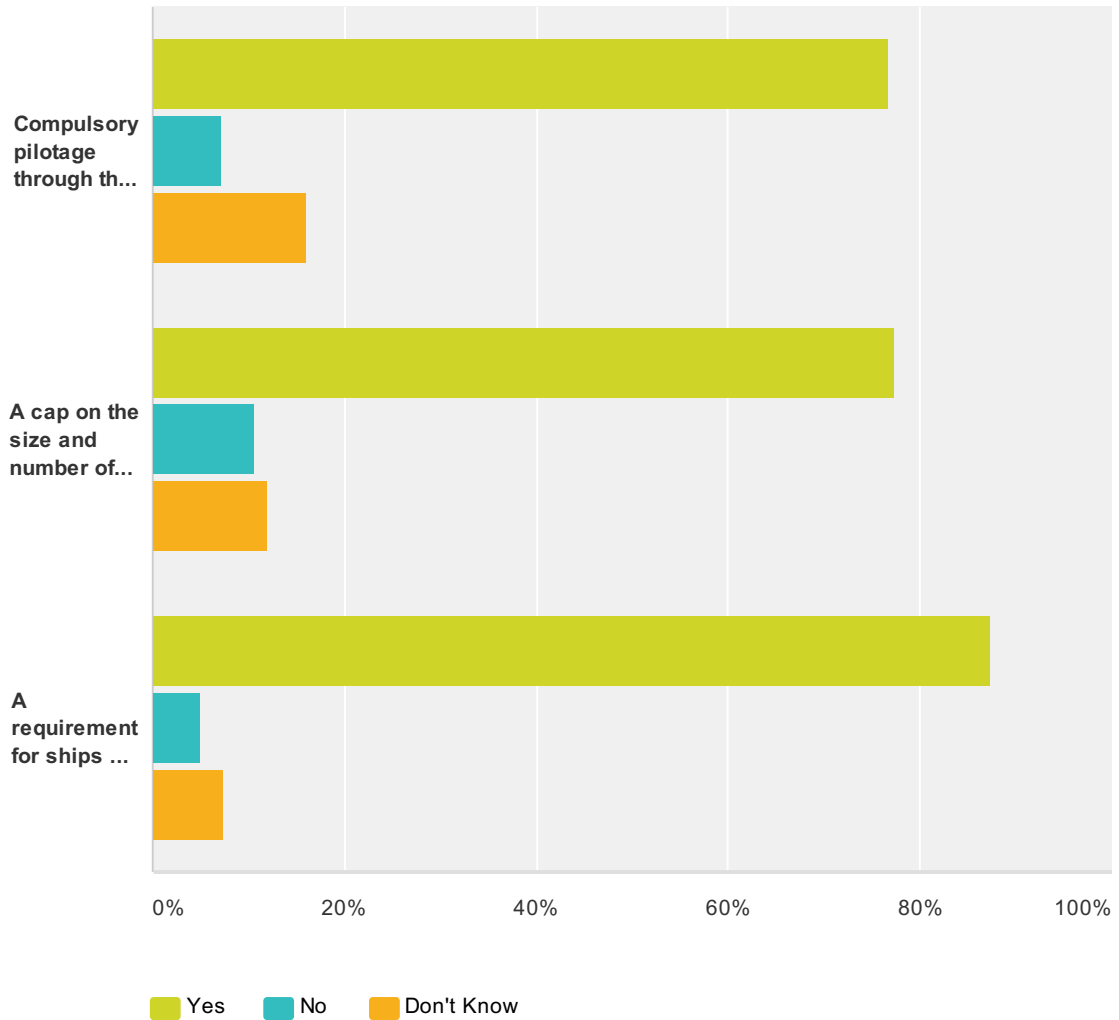

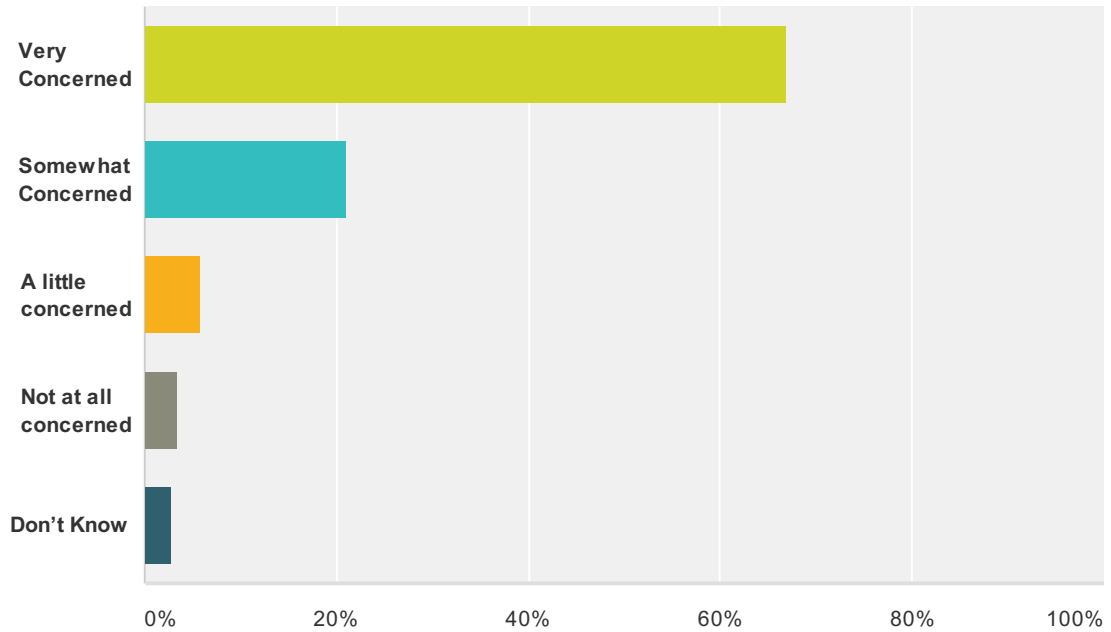

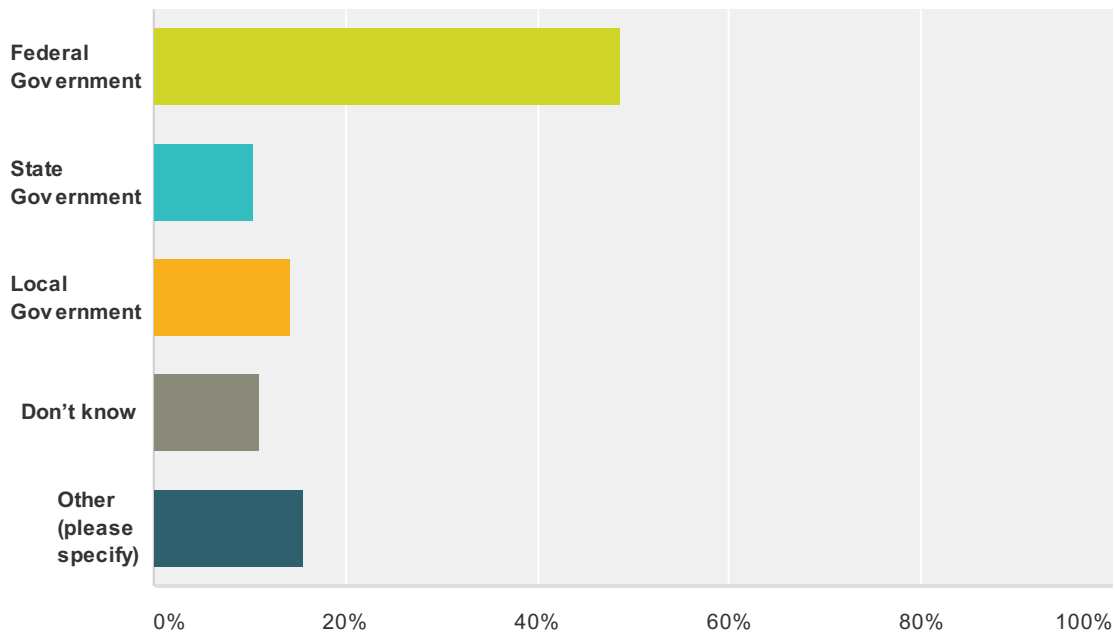

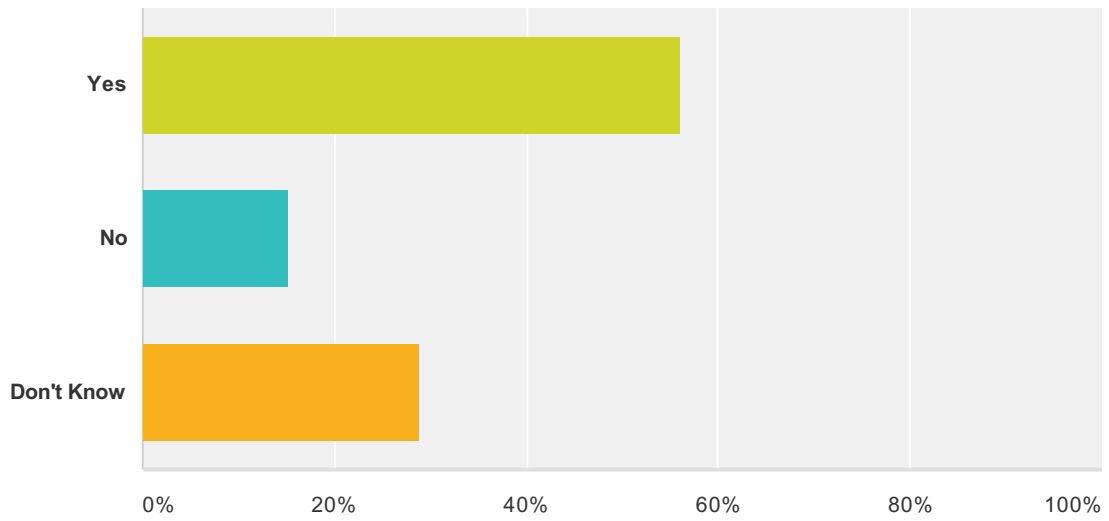

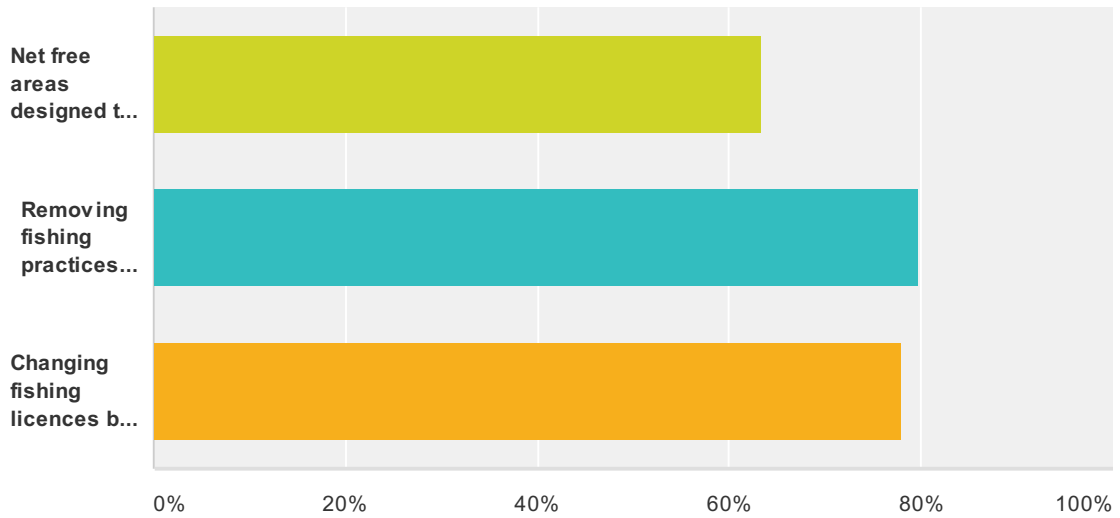

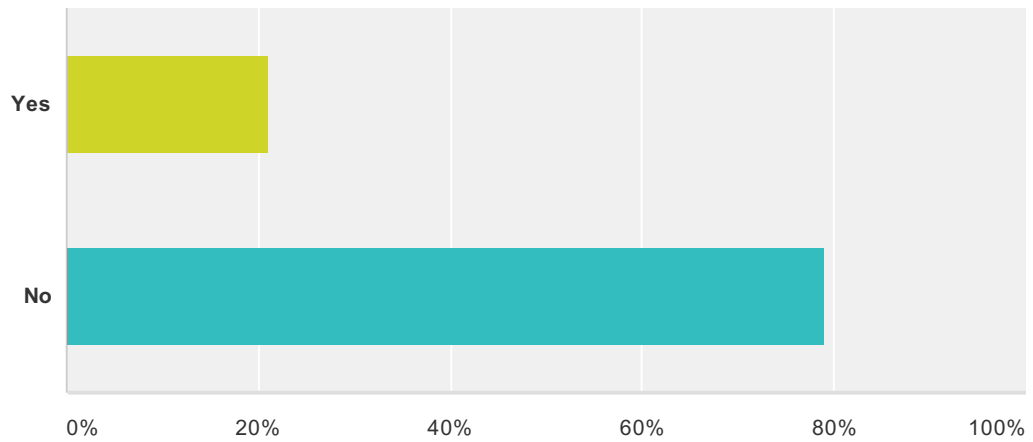

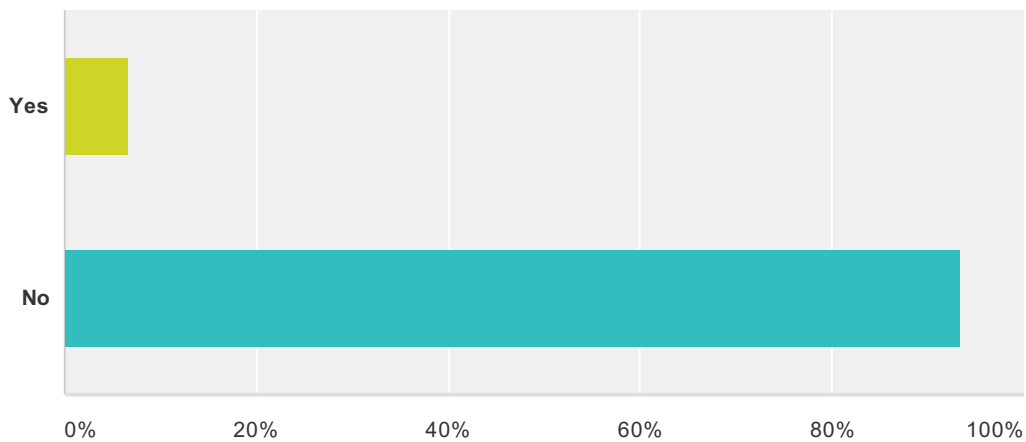

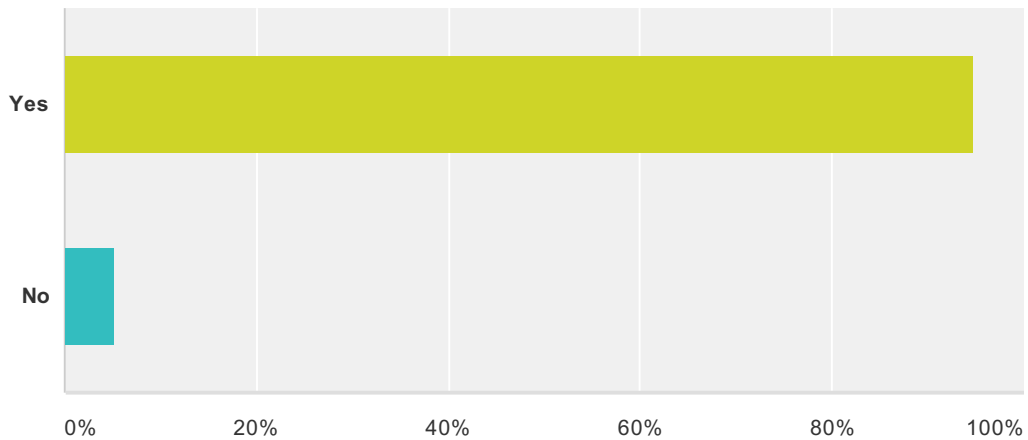
