




For over 40 years Peter has contributed his time, knowledge, skills and experience to conservation in a diverse range of academic, professional and community roles.

Peter is former Head of School of Earth and Environmental Sciences, James Cook University, former Chair and Director of the Wet Tropics Management Authority, former Director of Terrain NRM, founding member and former President for North Queensland Conservation Council and former member and Vice-president of the Wildlife Preservation Society of Queensland (Townsville Branch).

Peter's working career has included various roles in universities, the IUCN and government (both state and federal) with expertise spanning world heritage, natural resource management, protected area management, ecology, resource management and conservation.

Now enjoying semi-retirement, Peter is the Editor of North Queensland Naturalist, President of the Tree Kangaroo and Mammal Group, Tablelands Convener and Conservation Officer for Birdlife Australia NQ Branch, Chair of the Standing Independent Selection Panel for Terrain NRM and member of the IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas. It is no wonder Peter is considered a local champion in the FNQ conservation sector.
